n Maharashtra, the mentors visited Palghar, Thane and trained 20 mentees, on 17th November,2019. The objective of the visit was to understand and acquaint themselves with the social realities of Mentees, meet their parents to understand their viewpoint and most importantly to impart skills. This helped them understand, how the visual narratives support in analysing the ground realities and why it is important to make the people aware about the same.

The workshop focused on teaching the mentees, responsible usage of smartphones followed by a hands-on training for it. As a gesture to build further bonds between mentors and mentees, a set of about 25 tree saplings were purchased from the local Forest Department by the Mentors.
